# GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

In Portugal, domestic violence is a crime!

Domestic violence is any action or omission of criminal nature between people who reside in the same domestic space, or, when not residing, are former spouses, ex-partners, ex-boyfriend/girlfriend, parent of a common

child, ascendants or descendants (article 152,

Criminal Code).

Domestic violence is a universal social problem that can occur regardless of age, gender, religion, cultural identity, sexual orientation, education, or marital status. Immigrant individuals and individuals of Portuguese nationality are considered on equal terms in a context of domestic violence, as far as legal protection is concerned.

Gender-based violence discriminates against and penalizes people in relation to gender in a personal, family, work and/or social context.


Portugal recognizes the equality of rights for men and women within the following legal framework:

- The Universal Declaration of Human Rights
- The United Nations Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination against Women;
- The Constitution of the Portuguese
   Republic (article 13 CRP).

## Repercussions

#### WOMEN

- discrimination in the workplace: pregnancy, maternity, breastfeeding and lactation discrimination, time off for family and dependants discrimination, etc.
- difficulty in reconciling personal life with professional life
- lower participation in positions of authority
  - inferior salaries



#### MEN

- Difficulty in reconciling personal life with professional life
